Our Oregon Conference mission of why the Church exists: It's All About Jesus. What is the purpose of the Church? Knowing Jesus and others, Loving Jesus and others, Serving Jesus and others, and Sharing Jesus with others. God has graciously and generously blessed this coordinated mission with wonderful fruit. Yet, I am confident that He desires to do even more in and through His church. How? Guiding us into living in the presence and power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' twelve disciples and the additional followers who became His close adherents during His three and a half years of ministry on earth, did not fully understand nor experience the full personal and corporate transformation that Jesus had in mind for them during that time. Jesus was calling them into kingdom life and mission. That could only happen through spiritual transformation.

Jesus made clear that it was to the advantage of His followers that He ascend to heaven and send His Spirit to them (John 16:7). Jesus told them, "If you love Me, keep My commandments. And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever...for He dwells with you and will be in you." (John 14:15-17). All of this is to bring about the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) in our lives and the Church.

These transformative qualities are all the work of the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus has sent to indwell his people and Church, and not qualities that we can produce in our own efforts.

Our 2022 Gladstone Camp Meeting theme is "Metamorphosis." What exactly does that mean? Let's break the word into parts. Miriam Webster's Dictionary online defines "meta" as being "comprehensive." "Morphosis" is defined as the action, or "process of forming." Put together, the word "metamorphosis" means "comprehensive transformation", "change of form, structure or substance especially by supernatural means." In the case of Jesus' followers and church, this takes place in the Holy Spirit.

As we gather for this camp meeting, may we learn more about *living in the presence and power of the Holy Spirit*, so as to experience personal and collective metamorphosis!



#### **YY** CHILD SAFETY

The protection and safety of our children is a top priority. All our staff and volunteers are fully background checked. Please keep tabs on your children thoughout the day. As an extra precaution, parents are encouraged to take a photo of their minor children after they are dressed each morning. If the child becomes separated or lost, that photo can be immediately sent out to the campground staff, making quickly locating the child much easier.

**PROHIBITED** The following are prohibited on the grounds: firearms, fireworks, smoking, vaping, tobacco, cannabis, alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs. Also prohibited are bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades, and scooters.

All vehicles parked at an RV site must fit within the marked RV space and in such a way that the neighbors are not impeded or inconvenienced

Vehicles are not to be parked in the tent areas, except while loading or unloading belongings.
