LOCAL CHURCH ADOPTS SCHOOL NEXTDOOR

In Portland, Oregon, Healing Hope Adventist Church has been connecting with their local school for several years. In 2024, they decided to make supporting the Glenfair Elementary community their official mission.

Over the years, Healing Hope Church has supported the community in a variety of ways, from giving away popsicles in the parking lot and serving pizza at family nights, to donating classroom goods, snacks, clothes for emergencies and even adopting families at Christmastime.

Romey Carta, Healing Hope Church secretary, shared that she has grown a friendship with the secretary of the adopted public school. "She will contact me and she'll say, 'There's a need right now for something," said Romey. "I put the request out there — in the bulletin and newsletter — and it magically appears!"

According to Romey, Healing Hope Church is made up of 25-30 active members, while the elementary school hosts nearly 500 students. "This is the thing that's bringing life into this church," says Romey. "We can't do a lot of things, but God has enabled us to do this. He put us next door for a reason."



Violeta Bilan, Healing Hope district pastor, said, "I think creating spaces where children can mingle and learn how to navigate life together and feel like they're one community would benefit all of us. I think it's a gift."

Healing Hope Church has been able to impact many students, staff and families through these acts of simple connection. "It's not about big projects or big programs, but small acts of kindness and grace with nothing attached," shared Bilan. "It's just to brighten their day."

When asked for her advice on how churches might begin to connect with their own neighborhoods, Bilan said, "I would invite everyone to think of the 'little things' that your church may have fun doing that would benefit the communities around them. It may not need to be something big or have a large budget, just something your church can invest in — even simply buying a box of ice cream and sharing it with someone. It may be simple, but it's a powerful ministry."



PODCAST CONNECTS LISTENERS, STARTS CONVERSATIONS AND WINS AWARDS

Two years ago during camp meeting, members of the Oregon Conference communication team announced a new project seeking to better understand and heal relationships between Seventh-day Adventist Christians and their neighbors - a podcast called *Bridges Over Walls*.

Over the past two years, the show has grown to include two seasons and has featured nearly two dozen impactful conversations featuring a wide range of guests. From prominent Adventist thought leaders like José Rojas, Dr. Seth Pierce, Andreas Beccai, and Kevin Wilson to local leaders like Gladstone Mayor Michael Milch and Gresham Mayor Travis Stovall, as well as several young people who have wrestled with their relationship to Christianity, *Bridges Over Walls* has now been downloaded over 6,000 times on au-

dio platforms alone - both here in the Pacific Northwest and beyond.

One particular episode of *Bridges Over Walls* that focuses on trauma has been used in social work classes at Andrews University. And in 2023, *Bridges Over Walls* won both "Best Podcast" and the "Reger Smith Cutting Edge Award" at the Society of Adventist Communicators Convention in Springfield, Massachusetts. But wherever *Bridges Over Walls* has reached, its intent has stayed ever the same – to address the relational harms Christians have caused and to pave the way for healing in the future.


