GETTING TO KNOW BRANDON O'NEAL BY GREG BROTHERS

 \mathbf{F} or the past five years, Brandon OʻNeal has been the principal of Portland Adventist Elementary School. Last year, O'Neal added the job of part-time associate superintendent for the Oregon Conference. He's worked 24-years in education, with special training special education, and curriculum development. This spring, O'Neal became the Vice President of Education for the Oregon Conference.

This week, we got to sit down with him to talk about why he chose education as his life's work and what he hopes to achieve.

Why did you become a teacher? I struggled in school-but I had two outstanding teachers who made a difference: Mrs. Abshire in fifthgrade, and Mrs. Orlando in eighth. When I graduated from high school, I got a job and worked, but after four-years, I was ready to follow God's call and become a teacher.

Any regrets? I've never looked back.

Why did you become a principal? I like helping teachers grow. That's my job: growing good teachers who are well-trained and wellsupported.

How do you get good teachers? You hire good people-good people become good teachers.

You've worked in both public schools and the Adventist system - what's the difference? What I like best about Adventist schools is the sense of community. It takes all the pieces to make a good school - and in Adventist schools, you get the sense that



parents, teachers, principals, and pastors are all in this together.

As superintendent, how do you stay in touch with that community? That's one of my biggest challenges-not losing touch with parents, students, and teachers. That's why I plan to spend a lot of time in our schools, visiting with teachers and kids.

What about financial challenges? Always an issue-especially when we have so many school buildings that have been around so long. We need to make sure a school's outside matches the quality of education inside.

And the cost of this education? It takes courage for a family that has no money to walk through the doors of an Adventist school -but in my five years at Portland Adventist Elementary School, we always found ways for those students to attend. We have very, very generous churches.

Should time last, what do you hope to achieve in the next five years?

- Grow good teachers.
- Help the students who are coming out of the pandemic with all kinds of challenges both in terms of academics and mental health.
- Most of all, we need to keep showing Jesus in the classroom. We do a good job of this already, but we need to keep moving forward.
