# FOUR GENERATIONS OF CAMP MEETING

**D** own in the valley, nestled amidst a neighborhood of campers, Ruby Stevenson was relaxing in a chair in the shade, enjoying camp meeting as she has done for the majority of the past 82 years. Four generations of Ruby's family are attending this year including her daughter, Arlene, her granddaughter, Shalla, and her great-grandson, Sawyer.

"I think we started coming to camp meeting in about 1943," Ruby said as we sat on camp chairs together beside her camper on Thursday afternoon. "We moved here from back east, but my dad had been out here and he knew about camp meeting. So he started bringing us." When I asked Ruby about a few of her favorite things she said, "I love the meetings and I love getting around to see my friends, too."

As we talked, Ruby and Arlene shared many of the ways camp meeting had changed over the course of their lives. In the early days, campers used to cook their own meals near



their camp sites, stopping by the on-campus grocery store for fruits and veggies when needed. "Things were kind of like they are now," said Ruby, "They would have meetings and take the young people around to places. Some things were different, though. We had a regular store on the camp grounds and an ice house." Arlene, Ruby's daughter, chimed in: "They also had these boys who were the only ones allowed to ride their bikes. They would go around and deliver ice or messages or milk or whatever was needed... And I remember we used to follow behind the water trucks on hot days so we could get wet and cool down!"

One positive change Arlene and Ruby shared was the ability to watch the meetings from the comfort of their camper. "I'm 99 years old now. I'll be 100 in November," said Ruby. "I can't get around like I used to, but God has been very good to me - and I love camp meeting."
