EDUCATION DEPT BUILDING A COLLABORATIVE VISION FOR SCHOOLS

Here in the Oregon Conference, we're working with Loma Linda University and Andrews University to create a model conference that builds collaboration across schools and with churches. The Education Department has been working in collaboration with the principals to give substance to this vision. Referred to as the Oregon Goals, it is a focus on the significant cultural heritage as sons and daughters of God. It is educators' highest calling and privilege to guide and maximize opportunities for every child to develop fully, rooted in the strength of Christ.

The three overarching goals that the education team is committed to building for the Oregon culture are: Christ-Centered Culture, Positive Choice & Restorative Relationships, and Maximizing Individual Potential.

Goal one focuses on having each student understand their infinite value, belonging, and purpose as a created child of God. Intentionally guiding each student in building a relationship with Jesus is the goal.

Goal two focuses on developing self-efficacy in every student to make positive choices and develop respect for all things created by God.

Goal three focuses on 21st century skills needed for the ever-changing global job market: Communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and creativity. By structuring the classroom and curriculum to meet the personalized learning needs of each student, their gifts and strengths are maximized to become servant leaders for Christ.

A fifth grade student wrote the following letter to one of our Oregon Conference educators at the close of this school year. It is just one example of the impact our teachers have in the lives of their students.

Dear [Teacher],
Thank you for showing me what it is like to not struggle and to come up with different strategies in solving a problem. Before I came to [this school], I failed math. You have fought a fight for me and out of all the people in this world it was you who was willing to take time out of your day, night, and school time for me. You saw that I struggled and you never gave up on me.

Now because of your kindness, willingness, and care, I'll be able to go to sixth grade next year. I know I may be slow and think in a different way, but that does not define who I am. When I get to middle school I will tell people who got me there, and when I am successful I will think of you through it all.

All through the tears and laughs, you have been there for me. I'm sure the school I go to will help, but nothing will ever be the life-changer for me that you are. You don't look at

me and see flaws, you see hope and potential. Not only have you helped me in math, you've helped me become a young woman. Before I came to [this school] I knew who Jesus was, but I never gave him much thought. Now I know he heals, helps, and answers prayers. I can look up to the sky and know I'm not alone. Thank you.

This letter beautifully illustrates what Ellen White spoke about in her book Christian Education, p. 41: "When every teacher shall forget self, and feel a deep interest in the success and prosperity of his pupils, realizing they are God's property, and that he must render an account for his influence upon their minds and character, then we shall have schools in which angels will love to linger. Jesus will look approvingly upon the work of the teachers, and will send his grace into the hearts of the students."

May God continue to inspire and sustain our educators as they perform the sacred work of molding minds and shaping character. Our prayer is that our students will lead meaningful lives on this earth and choose to spend eternity with a graceful and loving God.



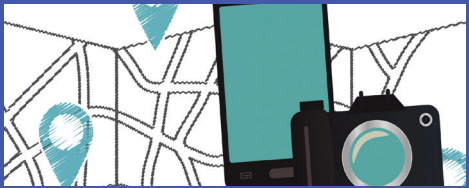
