PLANTING SEEDS OF FAI AND LEARNING

This year, something beautiful happened. Jaden, a young boy in gardening class, planted his very first seed. At first, he didn't know what to expect-just a handful of dirt, a tiny pot, and a few hopeful instructions from his teacher. But something clicked.... Now, his backyard has become a little jungle of joy-tiny tomatoes, basil, sunflowers, and strawberries. He talks to his plants, pulls weeds like a pro, and lights up every time a new leaf appears. And, with dirt under his fingernails and a smile as wide as the garden gate, he said: 'When I grow up, I want to be a gardener.' It's amazing how one seed, one class, one moment... can grow into a lifelong dream." - Tanya McCombs, Teaching Principal at Grants Pass Adventist School

Jaden's story is just one example of how school gardens across the Oregon Conference are impacting our students. At Grants Pass Adventist School, a hands-on gardening program and began in pots and buckets now includes a full greenhouse, raised beds, and indoor grow tent.

Students plant, transplant, test soil moisture, journal about their "dream gardens," and even sell starts-raising nearly $\$\bar{3}00$ to fund future projects. "Time in nature improves mental health and relieves anxiety," reflected Linda GPAS volunteer coordinator. "But more than that, it brings us back to our Creator." The school's greenhouse-now humming with student activity-was made possible through a volunteer-led auction dinner and built entirely by volunteers from constituent churches. Students at Grants Pass are truly getting their hands dirty and their hearts inspired.

Just north at Emerald Christian Academy (ECA) they're cultivating a vibrant agriculture program of their own. Now in its second year, the program, led by Wyatt Johnston, features a greenhouse, outdoor hoop house, growing beds, and fruit trees.

ECA's agriculture program includes a forest component as well. Restored trails and a large clearing have become an outdoor classroom, hosting church groups and community events alike. Looking ahead, the school plans to add classroom-based raised beds so each student group can tend its own garden quadrant. Principal Doug Gaylor shares, "Taking a timeout from electronics and screens is an amazing way to reconnect with God and restore balance to our busy lives."






