This is a report that shares the membership statistics of our Oregon Conference for 2025. Large numbers, and many of them. But each of these numbers represent individuals loved by our God, and members of our conference family. And so I invite you to reflect on our current membership statistics with that lens.

Church Entities

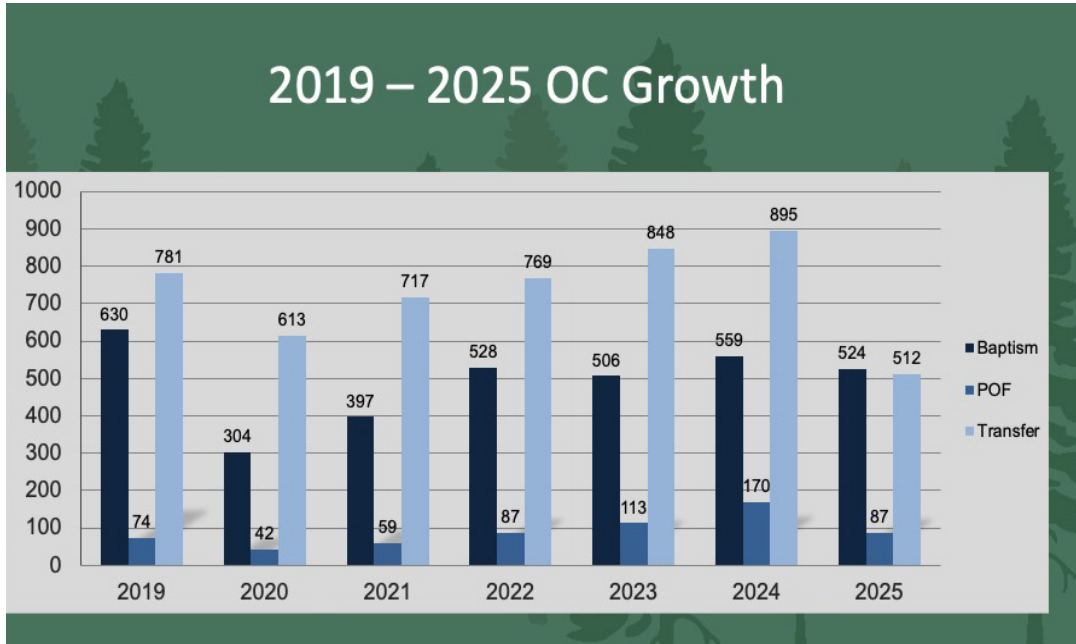
Our current church bodies include 137 churches, 14 companies, 14 groups and 28 schools.

In 2025 we celebrated the rebirth of the Portland Vietnamese Church. It had dwindled to the point of voluntary closure, but with support from the wider NAD Vietnamese community, a new church plant emerged to reach the Portland Vietnamese community for Christ. We also accepted the resolution to dissolve formal church status from the Sisters Seventh-day Adventist Church.



Membership Growth

We ended 2025 with a membership of 36,919, a net increase of .2%. Though this growth may appear incremental, it represents hundreds of lives being changed for Christ. Further, the rate of baptisms and Professions of Faith (POF) continued to hold strong, revealing the faithful witness of our members. In total, 611 people joined the Oregon Conference church through baptism or POF in 2025.



Membership Decline

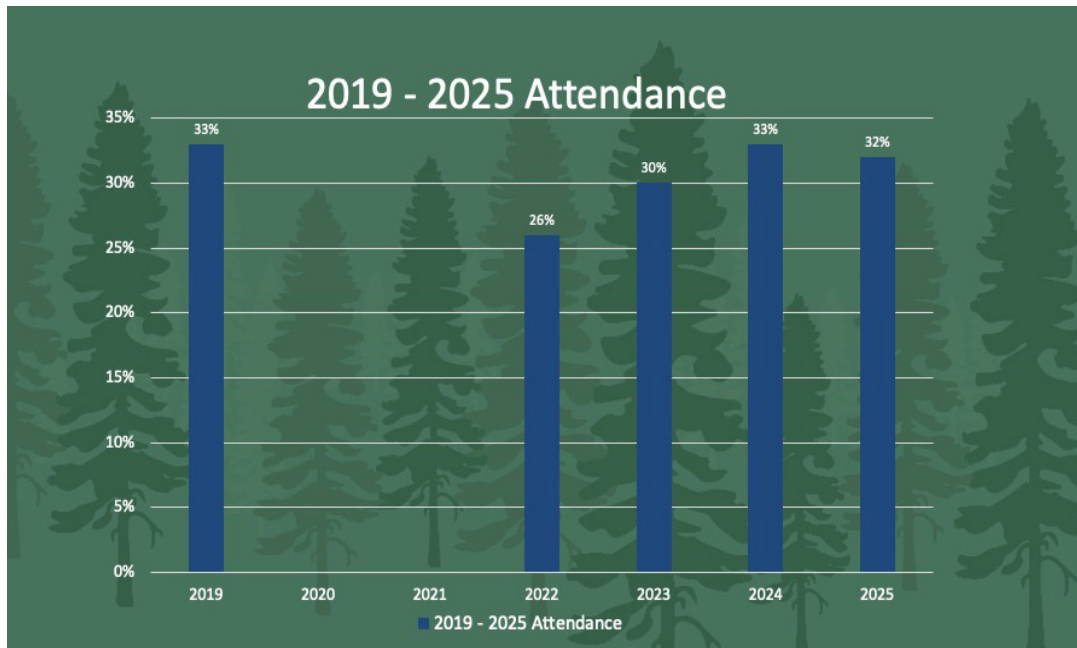
As always, we also said goodbye to family members who went to their rest in 2025 – slightly less than the previous year. There was, however, an increase in the number of members leaving through conference transfer, with the majority transferring to Upper Columbia, Georgia Cumberland and Washington Conferences.



Attendance

We have continued to work with our churches towards regular reporting of attendance and are thankful to now have the highest rate of reporting in the NPUC at 95% of churches now regularly reporting attendance!

Our average church attendance for 2025 was 11571 each week, which is 32% of our overall membership. This represents a 1% decrease when compared to the previous year.
