TRIP LOCATION

Our group will be hosted at Mara West Camp which is located on the edge of the Mara Triangle in the Masai Mara National Reserve, approximately a 6-hour drive from Nairobi, Kenya.



ACCOMODATIONS

At Mara West, there are 10 bandas available. Each banda is a brick duplex with a shared bathroom between two rooms, totaling 20 rooms. Every room is cozy and basic, furnished with 2 twin beds (or a queen bed upon request), bedside tables, and electricity. The bathrooms are equipped with a toilet, vanity, and a hot shower.

Feel free to inquire about upgraded accommodation choices for an additional cost.

Traveling to Kenya


What you need to know...



All participants must have a passport that is valid for at least 6 months beyond the scheduled return date.



An electronic travel authorization is needed to travel to Kenya. Cost is \$34 USD (https://www.etakenya.go.ke/en)



There are NO Covid -19 Travel requirements to enter Kenya.

Yellow Fever Vaccine is NOT required when entering Kenya from USA.



All volunteers should have their tetanus shot up-to-date. Please refer to the Center of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for current recommendations: https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/destinations/traveler/none/kenya

Enjoy a safari in a world renowned game reserve...

Mara West camp sits on the edge of the Oloololo Escarpment, overlooking the Mara Triangle. Considered by many to be the greatest game reserve in the world, the Masai Mara is 1,500 sq. miles of savannah abounding with wildlife. Wildlife includes the BIG 5, along with numerous other plains animals and predators.

AMS offers volunteers full-day safaris into the Reserve, and does its best to ensure up-close and personal experiences that are unforgettable.

Filtered water is available for refilling water bottles. Should you have a sensitive stomach, bottled water can be purchased.



Laundry services are provided at a minimal fee. Turnaround time is approximately 1-2 days depending on weather.


WiFi is available at common areas - dinning hall, pool, and office.

Sustainable Community Development

How to help without hurting...

The benefit of short-term mission trips has been debated over the years. Many volunteers have started projects—never to be completed... Communities have become accustomed to getting hand-outs rather than providing for themselves. People have questioned whether the expense is worth it.

Base Level COTTAGE







The cottages, custom-built for volunteer groups collaborating with Africa Mission Services, are currently under construction and are anticipated to be completed by December 2024. These accommodations comprise 10 brick duplexes, each featuring shared bathrooms serving two rooms, resulting in a total of 20 rooms. Each room is furnished with either two twin beds or a king bed upon request, complemented by bedside tables and electrical amenities. The bathrooms are outfitted with a toilet, vanity, and a hot shower to ensure the occupants' convenience. Although the cottages do not offer a view of the Mara, they are positioned in a picturesque setting surrounded by expansive fig trees, providing a daily spectacle of zebras roaming the




